X What Gloucester Stands to Lose with a NO Vote

Immediate Grant Losses if not in compliance by July 2025

- **\$400,000*** Water infrastructure (Gloucester Ave & Grove St)
- **\$500,000*** Wastewater facility design (Essex Ave)
- **[= \$1,000,000** Supplemental payment for Sawyer Free Library
- \$217,000 Sawyer Free Library LEED certification
- \$131,000-\$530,000 16.7% of Gloucester Housing Authority operating funds

Solution Future Grant Risk

• In 2024, Gloucester received **\$8.7 million in state grants**. Non-compliance could jeopardize similar future funding.

Weigher Local Taxes Likely

Without state funding, **Gloucester taxpayers will foot the bill**—and our tax dollars will go to other towns instead of staying here.

Still Required to Follow State Law

The Planning Board must create a new plan regardless of the vote outcome.

A "No" vote means Gloucester loses the ability to control its own zoning if we fail to approve a zoning plan, and the state will write Gloucester's zoning ordinance for us.
